

## Head of School's Newsletter

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope that you are all enjoying the cooler weather and that the smog is not causing too many concerns. At school we are taking precautions to limit the amount of exposure our students are having by monitoring the levels and substituting outdoor activities for indoor whenever practical.
